





- 1. The right is reserved to cancel, combine or divide any classes if entries so warrant. In addition, the right is reserved to refuse any entry before the start of the competition with out being liable for compensation.
- 2. Prize money will be applied to the exhibitor's outstanding account if any, or mailed to the exhibitor as listed on the entry blank within 30 days of the close of the show. Checks void after 60 days. The Horse Show will not stop payment or duplicate awards for any lost check.
- 3. A 4% convenience fee will be charged for credit card transactions.
- 4. Refunds: No refunds on stalls after the closing date. If a horse becomes injured or ill prior to being shown in any class, entry fees will be refunded upon receipt of a Veterinarian's certificate. An office-processing fee of \$25 per legitimately excused animal will be deducted from the refund. All certificates, to be considered, must be received by show management before the closing of the show. Can not scratch once a class has started.
- 5. Course diagrams will be posted at least one hour prior to each class. Main Show Ring 300' x 200'. Main Warm Up Ring: 220 x 200'. Ring 2: 275' x 160'. Ring 2 Warm Up: 200' x 160'. Footing in all rings the highest International Standard. Full drainage with the very best sand and GGT geotextile throughout.
- Temporary stabling of canvas construction with doors available at \$225 per stall. No initial bedding provided. No wiring of any kind allowed in the stabling areas. A charge of \$250 per stall, if available, for stalls reserved after the closing date on the stall reservation form. Stalls may not be shared or transferred.
- 7. Riders must be properly attired for all classes. Jackets are required in all classes unless waived due to inclement weather. Protective headgear is required at all times when mounted on the show grounds. It must meet or exceed ASTM standards for equestrian use, carry the SEI tag, and be properly fitted with harness secured. Formal attire (white breeches and riding jacket) for Classics and Grand Prix. The official EQUUS Foundation Best Performance Competition Armband is approved as official optional attire in all classes.
- 8. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have CURRENT MEMBERSHIPS and measurement cards for any and all classes, which require the same.
- 9. ENTRIES CLOSE by the date marked on the entry blanks. All entry & stall fees must be paid by the closing date of entries to not incur a late fee. No entry will be considered valid unless accompanied by full payment. Open checks will be filled in for all stalls ordered. No stalls will be reserved without payment under ANY circumstances.
- 10. Mail entries to Hunter Farms, 1315 The Great Rd Princeton NJ 08540 FAXED ENTRIES 609-921-3435 will only be processed upon receipt of a check.
- 11. The right is reserved to limit the number of entries accepted in any and all divisions. If entries must be limited, they will be selected on a first come, first served basis, selected by postmark date. Post entries will be accepted at \$50 per horse, only if time permits. Entries made the day of the show by totally new accounts, will be accepted at an additional fee of \$50 per horse, only if time permits.
- 12. Numbers will not be issued until a signed, open check is lodged with the horse show secretary and all USEF membership cards have been seen & verified.
- 13. Horses shown in a class with out being entered will pay double the class entry fee.
- 14. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF rulebook will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.
- 15. \$150 charge for non-competing horses
- 16. An office fee will be charged. Office fee is indicated on entry form.
- 17. A fee of \$250 will be charged to exhibitor's account for any returned check.
- 18. Should any question or dispute arise not provided for in theses rules, the same shall be referred to show management whose decision shall be final.
- 19. In accordance with GR1301.7: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
- 20. Breaking ties for other than first place will be done by time taken in the first round.
- 21. Classes with \$1,000 or more in prize money need 10 to fill. Otherwise 100% Sweepstakes of Entry Fees 30%, 20%, 15% 10%, 10%, 10%, 5%. 6 Entries needed to run class.
- 22. Sharps containers will be available in the stabling area.
- 23. Rider must compete in 3 separate events to be qualified for series awards. Series champion and reserve awards will be presented at the October final. Awards determined by prize money won throughout the series.
